## Any Given Child Bethlehem expands presence in Bethlehem schools

Adam Ercolani will direct the initiative as program manager

Adam Ercolani (he/they), teaching artist, performance artist, arts administrator and advocate, has been announced as the program manager for Any Given Child Bethlehem.

The John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in 2017 chose Bethlehem as the 24th site—and the first in Pennsylvania—for its Ensuring the Arts for Any Given Child program. The primary goal of the program is to assist communities in developing and implementing a plan for expanded arts education in their schools, ensuring access and equity for all students in grades K-8.

The <u>Zoellner Arts Center</u> at Lehigh University leads the initiative in collaboration with Bethlehem Area School District, the City of Bethlehem and the Kennedy Center.

The initiative supports K-8 schools with visiting community arts venues, community teaching artists, and learning through arts-based instructional methods as a result of teacher professional development. As of fall 2024, approximately 55 teachers at Donegan Elementary School, Fountain Hill Elementary School, and Broughal Middle School have received professional development in creative teaching strategies, resulting in impact to 800-1,000 students.

In this new position, Ercolani will drive Any Given Child Bethlehem's vision of building a learning community where every child experiences, creates, and values the arts through providing professional development for teachers and coordinating in-school and out-of-school arts experiences for K-8 students.

"I'm immensely grateful to have the opportunity to support a transformative initiative for our teachers, our students, and our city," says Ercolani. "It's beyond exciting to be a part of such a vibrant community that considers the arts to be not just important, but essential."

Ercolani previously worked as the Campus Engagement Manager for Zoellner, where they focused on infusing the arts into the everyday lives of Lehigh's campus community. They continue to teach with Touchstone Theatre, are an adjunct professor of theatre at Lehigh, and will continue working as a creative teaching strategies coach for BASD as a part of the Any Given Child initiative.

Ercolani earned degrees in Business Administration and English Literature from Misericordia University prior to completing an MFA in Performance Creation from Moravian University, and recently completed a Graduate Certificate in Women, Gender, and Sexuality Studies at Lehigh University. They are the recipient of the Donald and Mary Ann Hopkins Award for Excellence in Theater Arts and the Mary Ann Thompson Memorial Student Achievement Award, both from Misericordia University, and is a graduate of both the Intercollegiate Leadership Wilkes-Barre program and the Leadership Wyoming Program with the Wyoming County, PA Chamber of Commerce, as well as a member of the Association of Performing Arts Professionals' Emerging Leadership Institute, Class of 2025.
