



Zoellner Arts Center is committed to providing arts-based educational resources to its community. Dr. Ryan Hourigan shares his expertise with 34 Bethlehem Area School District vocal and instrumental music teachers in grades K-12.

About

Ryan Hourigan is a researcher, celebrated author, administrator, consultant and national workshop leader. Dr. Hourigan joined the faculty at Ball State University in the fall of 2006 after nine years of teaching music at the secondary and university level. Dr. Hourigan holds degrees from Eastern Illinois University, Michigan State University and a Ph.D. in Music Education from The University of Michigan and currently teaches music education and is the Director of the School of Music.

In 2009, Hourigan co-founded the Prism Project, which provides an opportunity for Ball State students to gain skills in the area of teaching students with special needs. The Prism Project model has been duplicated at several other areas around the country. Starting in 2012, Dr. Hourigan provided a series of presentations for The John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts that are now on the National Roster of presentations through the Kennedy Center.

A COVID ART PROJECT BASED ON A TRADITIONAL PICTOGRAPHIC CALENDAR OF NORTHERN PLAINS INDIAN NATIONS

Lehigh students are invited to record their experiences related to COVID via pictorial representations on the Lehigh University Winter Count - COVID Art Project canvas. The winter count, or waniyetu wowapi in the Lakota language, is a traditional Indian



calendar utilized by many Northern Plains nations. Commonly employing an animal hide or muslin cloth as the base, images representing the most important event that happened to the community each year were painted onto the hide or cloth.



Third Coast Percussion shares the story of how they got started with 9-12 grade students from the Lehigh Valley Charter High School for the Arts. The group plays performance footage from recent projects, discusses ways to stay motivated while practicing at home, and talks about how the ensemble adapts to digital programming in the era of COVID. A **Q&A with students** follows.

About

Third Coast Percussion began by playing DIY concerts in their native Chicago. They have performed on four continents, snagged two GRAMMYS[®] (plus a third nomination), made 13 albums, and broken down genre barriers repeatedly. For 16 years, they have been stretching the limits of classical percussion music through collaboration and experimentation.

Zoellner Arts Center aspires to provide transformative artistic and educational experiences to connect our community through the arts. The **Spring 2021 School Sculptures Residency Program**, directed by visual artist Kevin Reese, will work with **4th graders in the Lehigh Valley** to create large permanent moving sculptures for installation at their school.

This program has been adapted to a virtual experience for up to 250 participants. Students visualize their ideas for a kinetic mobile which materializes during the residency as students help Mr. Reese measure, draw, paint and balance each work of art. This programs connects both geographically and economically disadvantaged young people who may not have had the opportunity to participate in such a large-scale learning experience.

With your support, we will be able to virtually connect 4th grade elementary school students to Mr. Reese's guidance and knowledge and create mobiles derived by **collaborative processes combining art, math, physics and teamwork** to proudly display in each of their participating schools.







February 5 | SANKOFA DANZAFRO, an Afro-Colombian dance company, perform their work *The City of Others*. Artistic director Rafael Palacios created this work by drawing from the troupe's personal experiences with racism and oppression in their daily lives.

February 26 | ULYSSES QUARTET is a youthful string ensemble whose members hold a prestigious fellowship at The Juilliard School. They have mastered classical repertoire such as Bach, Haydn, Schubert and Ravel.

March 19 | THIRD COAST PERCUSSION is a Grammy Award-winning Chicago-based percussion quartet. For 15 years, the ensemble has created exciting and unexpected performances that redefine the classical music experience.

April 9 | DOM FLEMONS is a Grammy Award-winning songwriter, music scholar and multi-instrumentalist. He is "The American Songster" with a repertoire that covers over 100 years of early American popular music and a founding member of the Grammy-winning Carolina Chocolate Drops.

April 30 | CASEY ABRAMS, an entertaining Jazz bassist and vocalist, is a familiar face to fans of American Idol. He is musical chameleon, seamlessly blending traditional Jazz musicianship with contemporary pop sensibilities and a unique voice.

May 21 | JOAN OSBORNE, a multi-platinum recording artists, performs *Songs of Bob Dylan*. Since she broke through 25 years ago with her mega-smash *One of Us*, the seven-time Grammy nominee has never played it safe.



Program Summary: International celebrity musician Bakithi Kumalo, longtime bass player for Paul Simon and Will Smith, keyboardist and composer, residency at Zoellner Arts Center at Lehigh University from February 22- April 5, 2020.

High School and Middle School Students can apply to study and perform live alongside Bakithi Kumalo and Will Smith. This FREE mentorship program is open to aspiring musicians — drummers, keyboard players, bass players, guitar players, horn, woodwind and vocalists interested in auditioning to form a jazz/pop band under the direction legendary bassist Bakithi Kumalo which will culminate in a performance in Baker Hall.

About: Bakithi Kumalo is a GRAMMY®-Award winning bassist, composer and vocalist whose work was immortalized on Paul Simon's *Graceland* album. In addition to touring with Simon, Kumalo also recorded and/or toured with Gloria Estefan, Derrick Trucks and Susan Tedeschi, Laurie Anderson, Randy Brecker, Grover Washington Jr., Bob James, Angelique Kidjo, Jon Secada, Josh Groban and Chris Botti.
