



### Cornerstone Event: Honoring Visionaries in Celebration of Zoellner Arts Center's 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary

Zoellner Arts Center and Lehigh University have greatly benefited from the vision and generosity of Claire and Theodore L. "Ted" Diamond '37 '85H, lifelong champions of the arts, engineering, and entrepreneurship at Lehigh University.

Born in Brooklyn, N.Y., Theodore Diamond earned a B.S. in chemistry and metallurgy at Lehigh, an M.B.A. from Harvard Business School, and an honorary Doctor of Laws degree from Lehigh in 1985. He served in the U.S. Navy from 1941 to 1946, and worked at Bethlehem Steel during the war years, overseeing massive naval shipbuilding efforts that depended on steel generated by the plant.

After the war, Diamond worked in a family metal trading business before founding T.L. Diamond & Company, Inc. in 1950. He was owner and CEO of the New York City-based international non-ferrous trading firm that also specialized in precious metals.

Diamond created opportunities for generations of students to share his passions for entrepreneurship, science, and theater. He endowed the Theodore L. Diamond Distinguished Chair in Engineering and Applied Science, as well as the Theodore L. Diamond Center for Economic Education and Entrepreneurship in the College of Business.

Claire, an accomplished artist, and Theodore, inspired by his experiences onstage as a member of Lehigh's Mustard and Cheese Society, established the Claire and Theodore Diamond Theater Endowment Fund, creating the distinctive Diamond Theater in Zoellner Arts Center. They further invested in theatrical opportunities at Lehigh by establishing the Claire and Theodore Diamond '37 '85H Endowment Fund for the Department of Theatre.

Diamond also gave generously of his time. He was president of the Lehigh Club of New York, chair of the Tower Society from 2000 to 2010, served on Lehigh's Board of Trustees from 1981 to 1996, and continued as a Trustee Emeritus until his death in 2012. Since then, Claire and their son, Peter, also a former Lehigh University trustee, have continued to generously support the arts at Lehigh. The Diamonds also have a daughter, Patricia.

## ABOUT POSTMODERN JUKEBOX

When New York City pianist Scott Bradlee created Postmodern Jukebox out of a basement in Queens in 2011, his goal was simple: to remake the pop hits of today into the classic sounds of the legends of yesterday. Miley Cyrus became The Platters. Bruno Mars became Frank Sinatra. The Spice Girls became The Andrews Sisters. Guns 'n' Roses became Bessie Smith.

Now, over a decade later, Postmodern Jukebox has grown to become a pop culture mainstay in its own right, having played over a thousand shows on six continents worldwide — including acclaimed venues like Radio City Music Hall, Sydney Opera House, and Red Rocks Amphitheater. #### **ABOUT CHRISTMAS WITH THE CELTS**

Celebrating 12 years of successful national touring, Christmas with the Celts performs a wonderful combination of timeless ancient Irish Christmas Carols and lively Irish dance with modern contemporary songs but with Irish instrumentation. New Christmas hits, Celts originals and fresh Irish Dance tunes are added to the show each year so that no two years are the same.

This year Christmas with the Celts will introduce top Irish musicians Patrick D'Arcy from Dublin and Fiachra O'Regan from Connemara, Ireland. These two have performed with Bono of U2, Sting, Quincy Jones, The Waterboys, Bill Whelan of Riverdance, just to name a few. Also, featured will be the haunting vocals of beautiful singer/fiddler Luisa Marion.

An Irish Christmas would not be complete without the unpredictable Irish jokes (*craic*) and banter that occurs between band members and the audience every year and the always crowd pleasing fiery Irish dancers.

Show founder, Grammy-nominated songwriter, and film score composer Ric Blair says, "You can't listen to Celtic music and not be happy. Christmas with the Celts isn't just a concert; it is a spiritual experience of music and dance uniting communities. It's about bringing young and old together. It is a music of the people. I think that is why this unique melding of modern Christmas hits and organic Celtic instrumentation continues to resonate and grow in popularity every year with audiences."

The first live performance of Christmas with The Celts was in front of a sold-out audience at the original Grand Ole Opry and they've had multiple appearances on NPR, WSM Radio, and PBS shows like *Music City Roots* and *The Bluegrass Underground*. Later this year they are set to appear on the *Woodsong's Old Time Radio Hour* which also airs on PBS. Blair credits much of their success to their exposure on PBS. The group has shared the stage with Vince Gill, Cathy Jordan of Dervish, Mairead of Altan, Ricky Skaggs, Tim O'Brien, Patty Loveless, just to name a few.




